Directions to the Parish Hall/"Cry Room" and Bathrooms:

The parish hall is located in the basement of the church; this also functions as a "Cry Room" during Mass (there is a live feed of the Mass on a tv monitor so that you can still follow along). It is accessed by either the staircase near the bathroom at the rear of church (by the statue of St. Anne), or by the elevator (by the statue of St. Thérèse) -- please do not use the elevator *unless* there is need. Also, there are two bathrooms in the church hall near the kitchen.

Appropriate Attire:

To dress becomingly for God and neighbor, and in keeping with the reverence due to the Blessed Sacrament, kindly refrain from wearing shorts, tee-shirts, tank-tops, revealing blouses, sleeveless or backless dresses, form-fitting clothing of any sort. Ladies are highly encouraged to cover their heads whilst in church according to Apostolic Tradition and Scripture (see 1 Cor. 11:2-16), and have dresses or skirts fall below the knees; men are highly encouraged to wear suits and ties, or at least dress slacks and collared shirts. With due regard to time and circumstance, we encourage all to wear decorous attire befitting the sacred place and divine worship.
