His Excellency, Bishop Rhoades, will be coming to consecrate the parish to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. There will be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament beginning at 7:00pm with devotions to Our Lady; the hour will close with Benediction. Afterwards, there will be a light reception in the parish hall in the church basement.

First Friday and Lenten Devotions:

This Friday (**Mar. 4**) is the *first* Friday of the month. Exposition of the Bl. Sacrament will begin at **5:30pm**, during which we will have devotional prayers to the Sacred Heart, and then Benediction.

The *Stations of the Cross* will be at **6:00pm**, followed by low Mass at **6:30pm**.

Immediately after Mass, there will be a potluck soup supper until 8pm to conclude the evening.

Letters for Tax Deduction:

Letters indicating the amount donated to St. Stanislaus are available in the back of church. Please pick yours up to save the parish postage. If a letter for you is not there, please be assured it was an unintentional oversight; contact Msgr. Fritz and he will provide one right away.

Current Law for Fasting and Abstinence:

Fasting is required of those from the age of 18 until 59; one full meal is permitted per day, two smaller meals may be taken which together would not equal a full meal. No other food may be taken. Abstinence from meat is binding on those aged 14 and above.

CLARIFICATION:

Msgr Fritz **erred** in his inclusion of meat *broth* in the things forbidden by prescribed abstinence. Soup and gravy made from meat is forbidden, but it meat broth is not.
