ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Upcoming Wedding - Banns:

Mr. Zachary Kyle of Goshen, IN and Miss Abigail Lantzky of South Bend, IN intend to wed at St. Stanislaus on April 16, 2016. If anyone knows of any impediment to this union, please contact Msgr. Fritz as soon as possible. Let us all pray for the couple during this important time of preparation.

Votive Candles:

If you would like to light votive candles out of devotion, please ask an usher, an altar server, or the priest to provide you with a candle. The cost of the candles are \$3 each. The reason for this change is that the deficit caused by the cost of the candles is not sustainable for the parish, and in order to keep this laudable practice, something must be done to remedy the discrepancy between the cost of the candles and how much money is being given.

Reception of Holy Communion:

In order to conform with the rubrics, a communion rail cloth will be installed soon, so I'd like to take this opportunity to remind you of its use, and other general things about the reception of Holy Communion at the Latin Mass.

Use of the Altar Cloth:

The cloth will be draped over the top of the rail; it is intended that your hands go *under* the cloth. Ideally, the cloth should be held against the collar bone, with a depression in the cloth so it acts as a safeguard should the Host fall. The use of the cloth also means that parents should consider going to Communion alternately (or ask a neighbor for help) so that babes in arms will not impede the reverent and safe reception of Communion.

General Reminders:

It is best if only those *actually* receiving Communion kneel at the rail; this causes less confusion and makes distribution more efficient. When receiving Communion, no response is to be made; holding the head still, simply tilt it back, open the mouth reasonably wide, and stick the tongue out. Do *not* bow the head forward, lunge at the host, take it with the teeth, or leave the rail before the Host is completely in the mouth. Thank you. -Msgr. Fritz

Order of Malta:

[The Sovereign Military Hospitaller Order of St. John of Jerusalem, of Rhodes, and of Malta]
Mission of the Order

The Order of St. John of Jerusalem is one of the oldest institutions of Western and Christian civilization. Present in Palestine in around 1050, it is a lay religious Order, traditionally of military, chivalrous, noble nature. Its 13,500 members include Professed Friars and others who have made the promise of obedience. The other Knights and Dames are lay members, devoted to the exercise of Christian virtue and charity. What distinguishes the Knights and Dames of Malta is their commitment to reaching their spiritual perfection within the Church and to expending their energies serving the poor and the sick.

The Order of Malta remains true to its inspiring principles, summarized in the motto *Tuitio Fidei et Obsequium Pauperum*, nurturing, witnessing and protecting the Faith and assistance to the poor and the suffering, which become reality through the voluntary work carried out by Dames and Knights in humanitarian assistance and medical and social activities. Today the Order carries out these activities in over 120 countries.

Order of the Holy Sepulchre:

The Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem is the only lay institution of the Vatican charged with the task of providing for the needs of the Latin Patriarchate of Jerusalem and for all the activities and initiatives which are necessary to support the Christian presence in the Holy Land. The contributions made by its members throughout the world are therefore the Patriarchate's institutions' main source of funding.

The Order's support for the Christians in the Holy Land does not just take the form of financial contributions and prayers, important though we recognize that these are. All of the Order's Lieutenancies arrange formal pilgrimages, in the course of which Members do not simply view and explore the Holy Sites, but also have the opportunity to meet the people whom they are supporting and assure them that they are not forgotten.

The Order is charged, in its Constitution:

- † To strengthen in its members the practice of Christian life, in absolute fidelity to the Supreme Pontiff and according to the teachings of the Church, observing as its foundation the principles of charity which make the Order a fundamental means of assistance to the Holy Land.
- † To sustain and aid the charitable, cultural and social works and institutions of the Catholic Church in the Holy Land, particularly those of and in the Latin Patriarchate of Jerusalem, with which the Order maintains its traditional ties.
- † To support the preservation and propagation of the Faith in those lands, and promote interest in this work not only among Catholics scattered throughout the world, who are united in charity by the symbol of the Order, but also among all other Christians.
- † To uphold the rights of the Catholic Church in the Holy Land.
