Directions to the Parish Hall/"Cry Room" and Bathrooms:

The parish hall is located in the basement of the church; this also functions as a "Cry Room" during Mass (there is a live feed of the Mass on a tv monitor so that you can still follow along). It is accessed by either the staircase near the bathroom at the rear of church (by the statue of St. Anne), or by the elevator (by the statue of St. Thérèse) – please do not use the elevator *unless* there is need. Also, there are two bathrooms in the church hall near the kitchen.

Parish Social: Coffee-Doughnuts / Potluck:

Following the 10am Mass on Sunday, there are available for a free-will donation coffee and doughnuts. Also, there will be a potluck brunch. This event is located in the basement of the church. Please join us at this social event.

Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary:

This year the Feast of the Assumption (**Aug. 15**) falls on a Monday, thus it is *not* a day of obligation. However, to satisfy the devotion of the people to the Mother of God, there will be a sung Mass at 7:00pm on the feast (there will be no morning Mass, however).

Also, there will be a special blessing of herbs, fruit and other produce in honor of our Lady's Assumption prior to Mass. If you have items of this description that you would like blessed, please bring them to church and place them on the table designated for this purpose; the blessing will occur at 6:50pm. Please be sure to clearly indicate your name on your items so that you may easily retrieve them after the blessing.

Votive Candles:

If you would like to light votive candles out of devotion, please ask an usher, an altar server, or the priest to provide you with a candle. The cost of the candles are \$3 each.

First Friday Reminder:

There will be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament this Friday, August 5 at 5:30pm, with devotions to the Sacred Heart. Following Benediction, Mass will begin at 6:30pm.

Appropriate Attire:

To dress becomingly for God and neighbor, and in keeping with the reverence due to the Blessed Sacrament, kindly refrain from wearing shorts, tee-shirts, tank-tops, revealing blouses, sleeveless or backless dresses, form-fitting clothing of any sort, or any other raffish clothing.

Do let your dresses and skirts fall below your knees. Ladies are highly encouraged to cover their heads whilst in church according to Apostolic Tradition and Sacred Scripture (see 1 Cor. 11:2-16); men are highly encouraged to wear suits and ties, or at least dress slacks and collared shirts. With due regard to time and circumstance, we encourage all to wear decorous attire befitting the sacred place and divine worship.

"Free" Table:

In the church basement, there is a "free" table. If you would like to pass on some old items that someone else may be able to use (rather than throwing it out), please consider making it available on the "free" table. Anyone may take things left on the "free" table (children must have parents' permission, of course). *Before* leaving items, please contact Msgr. Fritz as to the appropriateness of the items you intend to place there; thank you.

General Reminder:

Please help keep the church a place of quiet recollection. Silence shows not only reverence for our Lord in the Bl. Sacrament, but also respectful courtesy to those who are praying. The basement is an appropriate place for conversations; and as the weather has been pleasant, outside is a preferable place to speak rather than the church. Thank you!

A Liturgical Lesson: *The Sign of the Cross*

"The sign of the Cross forms one of the most important features of the liturgy; for it is employed in the celebration of the Sacrifice, in the administration of the Sacraments, in all exorcisms, consecrations and blessings.

"The making of the sign of the Cross, or the signing of one's self with the cross is a profoundly significant and, at the same time, an efficacious act. It is first, full of holy mystery, of wholesome instructions and admonitions. The sign of the Cross is a symbolical expression of the principal mysteries of Christianity, a confession of the Catholic faith. It reminds us of the Crucified, of the price of our redemption and of the value of our soul; it enkindles love of God, strengthens hope, animates us to follow Christ on the way of the Cross; it indicates that in the Cross we are to find our honor, our salvation and our life; that we should prefer 'the folly and weakness of the Cross' to all the wisdom and power of the world, that, as disciples of the Crucified, we should combat under the banner of the Cross and by this sign triumph over all our enemies.

"As to the different meanings inherent in the sign of the Cross, often the one or the other is more clearly pronounced and more emphasized by the accompanying words; for the words and actions of the liturgy harmonize with each other, mutually supply and explain each other. This is also the case in the universally known formula: 'In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Ghost. Amen,' which in the plainest manner sets forth the mystery of the Holy Trinity symbolized in the sign of the Cross."
