Directions to the Parish Hall/"Cry Room" and Bathrooms:

The parish hall is located in the basement of the church; this also functions as a "Cry Room" during Mass (there is a live feed of the Mass on a tv monitor so that you can still follow along). It is accessed by either the staircase near the bathroom at the rear of church (by the statue of St. Anne), or by the elevator (by the statue of St. Thérèse) — please do not use the elevator *unless* there is need. Also, there are two bathrooms in the church hall near the kitchen.

Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary:

This year the Feast of the Assumption (**Aug. 15**) falls on a Monday, thus it is *not* a day of obligation. However, to satisfy the devotion of the people to the Mother of God, there will be a sung Mass at 7:00pm on the feast (there will be *no* morning Mass, however).

Also, there will be a special blessing of herbs, fruit and other produce in honor of our Lady's Assumption prior to Mass. If you have items of this description that you would like blessed, please bring them to church and place them on the table designated for this purpose; the blessing will occur at 6:50pm. Please be sure to clearly indicate your name on your items so that you may easily retrieve them after the blessing.

Blessing of Water for the Sick, and Candles in Honor of St. Raymond Nonnatus

Following Mass on Wednesday, August 31 there will be a blessing of water and candles in honor of St. Raymond Nonnatus. This water differs from "normal" Holy Water in that it is specifically blessed to help the sick. One who suffers from fever may be bathed in this water, sprinkled with it, or may drink it; indeed, it is the prayer of the Church that anyone who reverently and devoutly drinks or touches this water may regain health in body and spirit, and may persevere in the service of God. The candles are blessed with the explicit purpose to drive away and set to flight spirits of darkness.

From the *Maryknoll Missal* (1961):

Raymond Nonnatus (c. 1204-1240), a Catalonian, was a pioneer member of the Order of Our Lady of Mercy for the redemption of Christians enslaved by the Muslims. After freeing hundreds of Christian captives in Africa, he gave himself up as a hostage so as not to expose to apostasy those still unransomed. At length he himself was ransomed and he returned to Spain. He died soon after Pope Gregory IX had nominated him a cardinal. He believed, with St. John Chrysostom, that the greatest charity of all is to contribute to the salvation of a soul.
