From the Bishop:

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Next weekend we will celebrate World Mission Sunday, a day set aside by the universal Church to focus our attention on the mission of spreading the faith among those who do not know Christ. In his message for World Mission Sunday this year, celebrated within the context of the Jubilee Year of Mercy, Pope Francis characterized this mission to proclaim the Gospel as an immense work of mercy, both spiritual and material:

“On this World Mission Sunday, all of us are invited to ‘go out’ as missionary disciples, each generously offering their talents, creativity, wisdom and experience in order to bring the message of God’s tenderness and compassion to the entire human family. By virtue of the missionary mandate, the Church cares for those who do not know the Gospel, because she wants everyone to be saved and to experience the Lord’s love. She is commissioned to announce the mercy of God, the beating heart of the Gospel’ (*Misericordiae vultus*, 12) and to proclaim mercy in every corner of the world, reaching every person, young or old.”

Next weekend, October 22 and 23, we will have a concrete opportunity to support this missionary work of mercy through the annual collection for the Society for the Propagation of the Faith, which benefits more than 1,100 dioceses in Asia, Africa, Latin America and the Pacific. I ask you to be as generous as possible with this collection so that the Church may continue to proclaim Christ, the face of the Father’s mercy, to those who do not yet know Him.

Sodality of the Blessed Virgin Mary and St. Anne:


The Ladies' Sodality will be meeting on Wednesday **Oct. 26** at 7:30pm in the church basement.
