All Souls: Indulgences

A *plenary indulgence*, applicable only to the souls in purgatory, is granted to the faithful who (1) on any and each day from Nov. 1 to 8, devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, if only mentally, for the departed; (2) on All Souls' Day, devoutly visit a church or an oratory and recite an *Our Father* and *Creed* [see *Manual of Indulgences*, 29, §1].

In order to be capable of gaining indulgences one must be baptized, not excommunicated, and in the state of grace at least at the completion of the prescribed works. (N17, §1)

To gain a plenary indulgence, in addition to excluding all attachment to sin, even venial sin, it is necessary to perform the indulgenced work and fulfill the following three conditions: sacramental confession, Eucharistic Communion, and prayer for the intention of the Sovereign Pontiff. (N20, §1)

A single sacramental confession suffices for gaining several plenary indulgences [21 days before or after]; but Holy Communion must be received and prayer for the intention of the Holy Father must be recited for the gaining of each plenary indulgence (N20, §2)

First Friday Devotions to the Sacred Heart:

This Friday, **November 3**, there will be Exposition of the Most Blessed Sacrament at 5:30pm with the recitation of the Litany of the Sacred Heart at 6:10pm. Benediction will be given at approximately 6:20pm and the Mass will be offered at 6:30pm. Please come and receive the benefits of the devotion to the Sacred Heart!

Evening for Men:

The upcoming Evenings for Men/Holy League of Prayer will be Wed., **November 15** and Wed., **December 13**. Confessions will be heard from 5:30pm until 6:00pm, at which time there will be a talk. At approx. 6:30, the Blessed Sacrament will be exposed and the Holy League prayers and Rosary will be prayed. Benediction will be at 7:30pm; social time in the rectory will conclude the evening. All men are welcome and encouraged to come!
