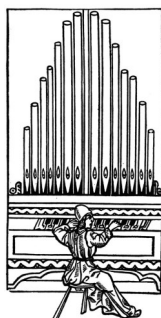


A Liturgical Lesson: *A Few Notes About Organs*

“From about the XIIth century, the organ became the privileged church instrument, the majesty and unimpassioned character of its tone making it a particularly suitable means for adding solemnity to Divine worship” (*Catholic Encyclopedia*).

“The traditionally appropriate musical instrument of the Church is the organ, which, by reason of its extraordinary grandeur and majesty, has been considered a worthy adjunct to the Liturgy, whether for accompanying the chant or, when the choir is silent, for playing harmonious music at the prescribed times,” Pope Pius XI, *Divini Cultus*, §28.

“The organ rightly hold the first place among instruments allowed in church. It is eminently suited for sacred music and ceremonies, and gives a wonderful brilliance and magnificence all its own to the Church’s worship. Its grandeur and sweetness deeply move men’s souls, fill them with an almost heavenly joy and lift up their thoughts to heaven,” Pope Pius XII, *Musicae sacræ disciplina*, §45.
