A Liturgical Lesson: *The Kyrie*

“After the *Introit*, the choir intones the *Kyrie*. When it first appeared in the Roman Mass during the sixth century, this chant, somewhat like the response *ora pro nobis* of the litanies, was a response by the people to a series of long supplications chanted by a choir of cantors. The Roman liturgy, as well as many Eastern rites, has kept it in the original Greek. The vernacular “Lord, have mercy,” which is still too often imposed on the faithful, is gradually counting fewer and fewer adherents: ‘I admit that I prefer this prayer in the Greek, as it has been kept not only in the Eastern Church, but also in the Latin Church, right from the origins of Christianity’ (Cardinal Lustiger, *La messe*, Bayard 1988, p. 71).

“Ever since Saint Gregory the Great, the Roman Mass has kept the number of three-times-three invocations, which expresses a Trinitarian supplication (the first three *Kyrie eleison* being addressed to the Father, the three *Christe* to the Son, and the last three *Kyrie* to the Holy Spirit). It also calls to mind the nine choirs of angels. On the other hand, the invocation of the *Kyrie eleison* has been justly considered as the summary of the whole prayer of the New Testament: it is the supplication of the blind man from Jericho and of the Canaanite woman, ‘Lord, Son of David, have mercy on me!’”
