October is the Month of the Rosary:

A *plenary indulgence* is granted to the faithful who (1.) devoutly recite the Marian rosary in a church or oratory, or in a family, a religious community, or an association of the faithful, and in general when several of the faithful gather for some honest purpose; (2.) devoutly join in the recitation of the rosary while it is being recited by the Supreme Pontiff and broadcast live by radio or television. In other circumstances, the indulgence will be *partial*.

1. The recitation of a third part of the Rosary is sufficient, but the 5 decades must be recited without interruption;
2. Devout meditation on the mysteries is to be added to the vocal prayer;
3. In its public recitation the mysteries must be announced in accord with approved local custom, but in its private recitation it is sufficient for the faithful simply to join meditation on the mysteries to the vocal prayer.

Free Rosaries:

There are Rosaries available in the back of church for free. Please take one if you or someone you know doesn't have one. It is an appropriate gift in order to encourage devotion to our Lady during the month of the Rosary!

Blessing of Rosaries:

Following the 7:00am Mass on Wednesday, October 7, the Feast of the Holy Rosary, there will be a Blessing of Rosaries.

Or you may exit the church and enter through the Candlelight Court door on the north side of the church which faces the rectory. Also, there are two bathrooms in the church hall near the kitchen.
