Annual Bishop's Appeal:

October is the Month of the Rosary:

A *plenary indulgence* is granted to the faithful who

(1.) devoutly recite the Marian rosary in a church or oratory, or in a family, a religious community, or an association of the faithful, and in general when several of the faithful gather for some honest purpose; (2.) devoutly join in the recitation of the rosary while it is being recited by the Supreme Pontiff and broadcast live by radio or television. In other circumstances, the indulgence will be *partial*.

1. The recitation of a third part of the Rosary is sufficient, but the 5 decades must be recited without interruption;

2. Devout meditation on the mysteries is to be added to the vocal prayer;

3. In its public recitation the mysteries must be announced in accord with approved local custom, but in its private recitation it is sufficient for the faithful simply to join meditation on the mysteries to the vocal prayer.

Directions to the Parish Hall and Bathrooms:

The parish hall is located in the basement of the church; it is accessed by either the staircase near the bathroom at the rear of church (near the statue of St. Stanislaus), or by the elevator (by St. Therese) – please do *not* use the elevator unless there is need. Or you may exit the church and enter through the Candlelight Court door on the north side of the church which faces the rectory. Also, there are two bathrooms in the church hall near the kitchen.

Appropriate Attire:

To dress becomingly for God and neighbor, and in keeping with the reverence due to the Blessed Sacrament, kindly refrain from wearing shorts, tee-shirts, tank-tops, revealing blouses, sleeveless or backless dresses, form-fitting clothing of any sort, or any other raffish clothing.

Do let your dresses and skirts fall below your knees. Ladies are highly encouraged to cover their heads whilst in church according to Apostolic Tradition; men are highly encouraged to wear suits and ties, or at least dress slacks and collared shirts. With due regard to time and circumstance, we encourage all to wear decorous attire befitting the sacred place and divine worship.
