Beginning the first week of November, Msgr. Fritz will be offering catechism class for children. The class will meet on Wednesdays at 7:00pm. The classes for adults will be on Thursdays at 7:00pm. October is the Month of the Rosary:

A *plenary indulgence* is granted to the faithful who (1.) devoutly recite the Marian rosary in a church or oratory, or in a family, a religious community, or an association of the faithful, and in general when several of the faithful gather for some honest purpose; (2.) devoutly join in the recitation of the rosary while it is being recited by the Supreme Pontiff and broadcast live by radio or television. In other circumstances, the indulgence will be *partial*.

1. The recitation of a third part of the Rosary is sufficient, but the 5 decades must be recited without interruption;
2. Devout meditation on the mysteries is to be added to the vocal prayer;
3. In its public recitation the mysteries must be announced in accord with approved local custom, but in its private recitation it is sufficient for the faithful simply to join meditation on the mysteries to the vocal prayer.

All Saints Day:

Following Mass on Sunday, November 1, there will be a party in honor of all the Saints. We encourage the children to dress up as their patron, or another of their favorite friends of God. There will be games and activities for the children, and food and drink.

Notre Dame Chorale:

On Nov. 1 at **2:00pm** in the Leighton Concert Hall at the Univ. of Notre Dame, the Notre Dame Chorale will be performing a concert entitled: *From St. Francis to Pope Francis: Songs for the Earth and its Creatures*. The program will be one hour without intermission. Tickets are \$10 for adults, \$6 for students.

7:00am low Mass, 12:15pm low Mass, 7:00pm sung Mass.

Appropriate Attire:

To dress becomingly for God and neighbor, and in keeping with the reverence due to the Blessed Sacrament, kindly refrain from wearing shorts, tee-shirts, tank-tops, revealing blouses, sleeveless or backless dresses, form-fitting clothing of any sort, or any other raffish clothing.

Do let your dresses and skirts fall below your knees. Ladies are highly encouraged to cover their heads whilst in church according to Apostolic Tradition; men are highly encouraged to wear suits and ties, or at least dress slacks and collared shirts. With due regard to time and circumstance, we encourage all to wear decorous attire befitting the sacred place and divine worship.
