

Low Sunday: Divine Mercy Indulgences

A plenary indulgence is granted under the usual conditions (Sacramental Confession, Communion and prayer for the intentions of the Pope) to the faithful who, on Low Sunday (that is, today), in any church or chapel, in a spirit that is completely detached from the affection for a sin, even a venial sin, take part in the prayers and devotions held in honor of Divine Mercy, or who, in the presence of the Bl. Sacrament exposed or reserved in the tabernacle, recite the *Our Father*, and the *Creed*, adding a devout prayer to the merciful Lord Jesus (eg, Merciful Jesus, I trust in you!); a partial indulgence is granted to the faithful who, at least with a contrite heart, pray to the merciful Lord Jesus a legitimately approved invocation.
