Three Hearts Pilgrimage:

The *Three Hearts Pilgrimage* is a sacrificial walk by design, with the intention of providing a safe journey for souls to offer their spiritual and physical suffering for the sanctity of life and in defense of the traditional family unit, in



which God intended to be modeled after the Holy Family. Although difficult and penitential, many pilgrims return each year to experience the joy and beauty they find here when they come with thousands of others to sacrifice in union with one another.

The annual *Three Hearts Pilgrimage* guides thousands of participants through a rigorous terrain for 35 miles over 2 days (**Oct. 10-12**) to their destination - the Benedictine monastery Clear Creek Abbey (Hulbert, OK). Appropriate Attire:

To dress becomingly for God and neighbor, and in keeping with the reverence due to the Blessed Sacrament, kindly refrain from wearing revealing blouses (décolletage), sleeveless or backless dresses, form-fitting clothing of any sort, or any other raffish clothing.

Do let your dresses and skirts fall below your knees. Ladies are highly encouraged to cover their heads whilst in church according to Apostolic Tradition and Sacred Scripture (see 1 Cor. 11:2-16); men are highly encouraged to wear suits and ties, or at least dress slacks and collared shirts. With due regard to time and circumstance, we encourage all to wear decorous attire befitting the sacred place and divine worship.

Chivalric Order:

The Militia of the Temple is a Roman-Catholic lay Order: A knightly order with a Christian combative tradition; with reference to knightly virtues; which draws strength from the mystic and spirituality of St. Bernard and refers to his writings, yet neither declaring nor claiming a false, antihistorical and illegitimate direct descent from the old Order; which has both married and celibate consecrated members; whose purpose is the salvation of the soul by means of prayer, the holy Sacraments and the spirit of knighthood; which fully accomplishes its Christian ideals through service to the Church and to neighbors; which is canonically recognized as a private association of faithful of diocesan right according to can. 298, 299, 301.
