Beginning today, Sunday, **October 6**, the parish will publicly pray sung Vespers on Sunday. We will begin at 5:15pm; upon the conclusion of Vespers the Blessed Sacrament will be exposed, and there will be a brief period of silent adoration, then the Angelus will be sung at 6:00pm, followed by Benediction.
