Feast of Christ the King:

Today, Sunday, **October 27**, there will be a Eucharistic Procession and Benediction at the conclusion of the 10am Mass in honor of Christ the King. Please be prepared to participate in this devotion. The *Act of Consecration of the Human Race to the Sacred Heart* will be prayed to fulfill one of the requirements of a plenary indulgence offered that day.

All Saints Day Party:

On Sunday, **November 3**, following the 10am Mass, there will be an All Saints Pageant. We are accepting donations of candy and sweets for the children. In order to encourage the habit of the spiritual work of mercy, we ask that on each piece of candy the name of a deceased loved one is clearly placed - the child will then offer a prayer for the repose of that person's soul before enjoying the treat.

Sunday Vespers:

Today, Sunday, **October 27**, the parish will publicly pray sung Vespers. We will begin at 5:15pm; at the end of Vespers, the Blessed Sacrament will be exposed, and there will be a brief period of silent adoration. At 6:00pm, the Angelus will be sung, followed by Benediction. The text / chants of Vespers will be provided.

Compline: *The night office of the Church*

Please join us in chanting *Compline* every Tuesday evening after the 6:30pm Mass and Rosary (we start around 7:30pm). Text with musical notation are provided. Even if you do not chant with us, come and pray!

All Souls: Indulgences

A *plenary indulgence*, applicable only to the souls in purgatory, is granted to the faithful who (1) on any and each day from Nov. 1 to 8, devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, if only mentally, for the departed; (2) on All Souls' Day, devoutly visit a church or an oratory and recite an *Our Father* and *Creed* [see *Manual of Indulgences*, 29, §1].

In order to be capable of gaining indulgences one must be baptized, not excommunicated, and in the state of grace at least at the completion of the prescribed works. (n17, §1)

To gain a plenary indulgence, in addition to excluding all attachment to sin, even venial sin, it is necessary to perform the indulgenced work and fulfill the following three conditions: sacramental confession, Eucharistic Communion, and prayer for the intention of the Sovereign Pontiff. (n20, §1)

A single sacramental confession suffices for gaining several plenary indulgences [21 days before or after]; but Holy Communion must be received and prayer for the intention of the Holy Father must be recited for the gaining of each plenary indulgence (n20, §2).

Education Series:

Msgr. Fritz will be giving an educational series on the Sacraments covering their scriptural typology and symbolism. Blessing of Water in Honor of St. Willibrord:

Following the Mass at 7:00am on Thursday, **November 7**, there will be a blessing of water in honor of St. Willibrord. This saint was the bishop of Utrecht. This water is empowered to drive out sickness and devils; it may be drunk, or sprinkled on people or in places. If you would like to take advantage of this blessing, please bring a container of water and place it on the table near the Blessed Virgin's altar.
