Sunday Vespers:

Holy Day of Obligation: *Immaculate Conception*

According to the rubrics of the liturgical books in force in 1962, the rubrics which priests of the FSSP are obligated to follow, the Immaculate Conception is to be celebrated on Sunday, December 8; the Second Sunday of Advent will be commemorated that day.

However, Monday, **December 9**, is *also a holy day of obligation*. In the Diocese of Fort Wayne-South Bend, it is the anniversary of the dedication of the cathedral, so the Mass will be that of Dedication of a Church and offered at 7:00am and 7:00pm.

Rorate Mass and Advent Recollection:

The *Rorate* Mass is a traditional Advent devotion wherein the Mass of the Blessed Virgin Mary for Advent is offered just before dawn and the church is lit only by candlelight. In the dimly lit setting, priests and faithful prepare to honor the Light of the world, Who is soon to be born, and offer praise to God for the gift of Our Lady. As the Mass proceeds and sunrise approaches, the church becomes progressively brighter, illumined by the sun as our Faith is illumined by Christ. The interplay of light and darkness speak to the meaning of Advent and the coming of the Light of the world.
