ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Low Sunday: *Divine Mercy Indulgences*

A plenary indulgence is granted under the usual conditions (Sacramental Confession, Communion and prayer for the intentions of the Pope) to the faithful who, on Low Sunday, (Sunday, April 27) in any church or chapel, in a spirit that is completely detached from the affection for a sin, even a venial sin, take part in the prayers and devotions held in honor of Divine Mercy, or who, in the presence of the Bl. Sacrament exposed or reserved in the tabernacle, recite the *Our Father* and the *Creed*, adding a devout prayer to the merciful Lord Jesus (eg, Merciful Jesus, I trust in you!); a partial indulgence is granted to the faithful who, at least with a contrite heart, pray to the merciful Lord Jesus a legitimately approved invocation.

Sunday Vespers:

Every Sunday, including today, April 27, the parish publicly prays sung Vespers. We begin at 5:15pm; at the end of Vespers, the Blessed Sacrament will be exposed, and there will be a brief period of silent adoration. At 6:00pm, the Angelus will be sung, followed by Benediction. The text / chants of Vespers will be provided.

Compline: *The night office of the Church*

Please join us in chanting *Compline* every Tuesday evening after the 6:30pm Mass and Rosary (we start around 7:30pm). Text with musical notation are provided. Even if you do not chant with us, come and pray!

Blessing of Palms or Foliage:

In honor of St. Peter the Martyr, there will be the Blessing of Palms (or other foliage) following the 6:30pm Mass on Tuesday, **April 29**. Palms or other types of tree branches are blessed for the purpose of driving away the enemy of mankind, the devils, from homes and any place where they are hung; as well as protection from damage resulting from lightning or storms.

Feast of St. Catherine of Siena:

The First Class Relic of St. Catherine will be available for individual veneration immediately following the 7:00am Mass on Wednesday, **April 30**.

First Friday / First Saturday:

In devotion to the Sacred and Immaculate Hearts, there will be an hour of solemn Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament on both Friday, **May 2** (at 5:30pm) and on Saturday, **May 3** (at 9:00am); Benediction will close the hour.

May Crowning:

The annual May Crowning of Our Lady will be Sunday, **May 4** following the 10:00am Mass. As in previous years, we would like all the children of the parish to participate in this event in a special way: the children should gather by the main entrance of the church immediately following Mass; there they will be given a flower to offer to Our Lady; they will process in the main aisle to the statue of the Blessed Virgin and will be assisted in placing their flower. Once all the children have given their flower, and returned to the pew with their family, we will process out to the grotto and back.



Easter Egg Hunt:

The egg hunt is scheduled for next Sunday, **May 4**. Please have your child bring a basket or a bag to collect their eggs. Candy is still needed!
