Second Collection: *World Mission Sunday*

Each year a time of prayer and giving to support the missionary work of the Church is dedicated in October. Today Sunday, **October 19**, is that time to take a collection to fund the Society for the Propagation of the Faith which supports 1,124 missions worldwide. The funds raised will foster the proclamation of the Gospel, building of churches and schools, and provide provisions of food and medical care to vulnerable communities. Our own country was missionary territory at one time and the Church here owes much to the generosity of far away Catholics. We have an opportunity to "pay it forward" to the Church in other, less fortunate, parts of the world. This is not only an ancient practice (see 2 Cor. 11:8), but a very laudable one. May God reward you for your generosity.

Today, Sunday, **October 19** there will be an open meeting in the lower level of church after the 10am Mass to discuss the future of scouting/boys' ministry at St. Stanislaus. All families interested are invited.

Sunday Vespers:

Vespers is an important part of the official prayer of the Church, and it is our hope to build a culture where our lives fully revolve around the liturgy, in all of its richness. Every Sunday, the parish will publicly pray sung Vespers. We will begin at 5:15pm; upon the conclusion of Vespers the Blessed Sacrament will be exposed, and there will be a brief period of silent adoration, then the Angelus will be sung at 6:00pm, followed by Benediction.

This Wednesday, **October 22** at 7:00pm, there will be a Vespers practice in the lower level of the church. We will go over the chants for the Feast of Christ the King. Even if you have no prior experience, you are welcome to come learn!
