All Souls: Indulgences

A *plenary indulgence*, applicable only to the souls in purgatory, is granted to the faithful who (1) on any and each day from Nov. 1 to 8, devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, if only mentally, for the departed; (2) on All Souls' Day, devoutly visit a church or an oratory and recite an *Our Father* and *Creed* [see *Manual of Indulgences*, 29, §1].

In order to be capable of gaining indulgences one must be baptized, not excommunicated, and in the state of grace at least at the completion of the prescribed works. (n17, §1)

To gain a plenary indulgence, in addition to excluding all attachment to sin, even venial sin, it is necessary to perform the indulgenced work and fulfill the following three conditions: sacramental confession, Eucharistic Communion, and prayer for the intention of the Sovereign Pontiff. (n20, §1)

A single sacramental confession suffices for gaining several plenary indulgences [21 days before or after]; but Holy Communion must be received and prayer for the intention of the Holy Father must be recited for the gaining of each plenary indulgence (n20, §2).

First Friday:

The First Friday of the month occurs this week, so to express our devotion to the Sacred Heart and *to make reparation for sin*, there will be Solemn Exposition of the Most Blessed Sacrament on Friday, **November 7** at 5:30pm. Benediction will be given just before the 6:30pm Mass.

Blessing of Water in Honor of St. Willibrord:

Following the Mass at 6:30pm on Friday, November 7, there will be a blessing of water in honor of St. Willibrord. This saint was the bishop of Utrecht. This water is empowered to drive out sickness and devils; it may be drunk, or sprinkled on people or in places. If you would like to take advantage of this blessing, please bring a container of water and place it on the table near the Blessed Virgin's altar.
