ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Sunday Vespers:

Vespers is an important part of the official prayer of the Church, and it is our hope to build a culture where our lives fully revolve around the liturgy, in all of its richness. Every Sunday, the parish will publicly pray sung Vespers. We will begin at 5:15pm; upon the conclusion of Vespers the Blessed Sacrament will be exposed, and there will be a brief period of silent adoration. The Angelus will be sung at 6:00pm, followed by Benediction.

Vespers Practice:

Every Tuesday from **November 25** through December 23 there will be a brief practice in the lower level of the church following the Rosary (about 7:30pm). We will go over the chants of the upcoming Sunday's Vespers each week to prepare for the unique chants which Holy Mother Church gives us to sing during this Advent season.

Thanksgiving Day:

This Thursday, **November 27** is the National Holiday of Thanksgiving. Mass will be offered at <u>8:30am</u> instead of the regular time of 7:00am.

Diocesan Synod: Parish Prayerful Opening

All the faithful are called to participate through prayer and reflection in the Diocesan Synod. We will begin the parish phase with a votive Mass of Our Lady, Mediatrix of All Graces on Friday, November 28 at 6:30pm. There will be a sermon on the synod. Also, Advent will be a time of prayerful reflection on the topics to be addressed by the synod.
